



Year 1 Spring Newsletter

Dear Parents / Guardians,

Happy New Year! We hope you all enjoyed the Christmas break. Thank you for all the lovely gifts - they were greatly appreciated. Miss Holmes is very excited to be back in Year 1 after her maternity leave.

This letter will give you an outline of some of the things we will be covering in class this term.

English

The majority of our English work is based around key texts. We will be focusing on writing in sentences, using capital letters and full stops correctly and using connectives in our writing; we are continuing to encourage joined handwriting. We will continue with our regular phonics sessions, working through Phase 5 of Letters and Sounds.

Maths

In Maths we will be covering a range of topics. This will include continuing to develop understanding of number, doubling and halving and counting in 2's, 5's and 10's, learning about odd and even numbers, understanding money, 3D shapes and ordering days of the week and months of the year. Children will have opportunities to use this knowledge to solve problems.

Science

In Science, we will be learning about everyday materials and plants.

History

In History, we shall be learning about Neil Armstrong.

Geography

We will start looking at the location of our school and homes. We will also look at our local area.

Computing

This term we will begin to learn how to create simple programs.

PE

Please ensure that your child has a full PE kit in school every day. This should include a named tracksuit for outside games, as well as shorts and plimsolls for indoor activities.

Art/Music

Much of the Art will be linked to either the book that we are studying in English or our other topics, whilst teaching new skills at the same time. In Music, the children will listen to different styles of music and find out about the origins of these different styles.

RE

In R.E, we will be learning about some aspects of Judaism, including the Synagogue and Torah. We will also learn about the beliefs of Christians and how this affects their daily lives. Later in the term, we will visit a local church to learn about how Christians might choose to worship. We will then learn about some of the Easter story.

Homework

Please remember that the children should be reading at home every day as part of their regular homework routine.

This term, we will begin to send spellings home every Friday for your child to learn. The children have their spelling test on Thursdays.
