

Year 6 Homework

This term, homework will be the same as before Christmas. We have seen real benefits for the children who have been completing this work regularly. There is an optional project that you may choose to complete if you find that you have a lot of time on your hands, but the basic skills work must take priority.

We will outline how much time we would like you to spend on each activity throughout each week and leave it to you and your adults at home to decide how your time should be organised around various extracurricular activities.

- Reading – 20 minutes 5 times per week
- Doodle Maths – 10 minutes, 3 or 4 times per week (stay in the Green Zone)
- Times Tables / Doodle Tables - 10 minutes 3 or 4 times per week (less if you know them well)
- Spelling – 5-10 minutes 3 or 4 times per week
- Bedrock – please complete two lessons per week

Of course, you can do more than this if you wish but please make sure you spread your learning out across the week. For example, doing all your spelling work in one go on a Thursday evening will **not** support your learning of spelling rules.

Optional Project Homework:

As we will learn in school, evolution has led to some very interesting adaptations in the animal kingdom.



Your task:

Choose an interesting animal adaptation (or more than one). Research it and present your findings.

You can do this however you choose, perhaps by:

- Making a video or presentation about it
- Preparing or recording a speech or podcast about the adaptation, perhaps in character as the animal
- Drawing, writing, typing or making an annotated 3D model of the animal to show us what you have learned

If you choose to complete this project, **please let your teacher know** so that they can plan in time for you to present it to the class. This should be presented **by 3rd February**.
